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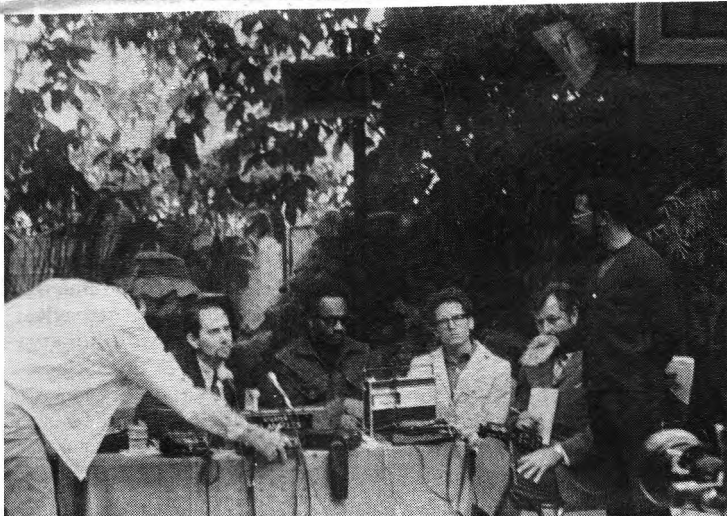

ANTI-WAR PRESS CONFERENCE

The National Mobilization Committee for Nov 14th held a press conference on Monday, Oct. 27th, at the Los Angeles Press Club to issue details for the demonstrations against the war in Vietnam on Nov. 13, 14 & 15th.

Spokesmen and members of the contributing groups of the National Mobilization Committee, including the Communist Party U.S.A. (Marxist-Leninist), the United Front and the Red Women's Detachment discovered upon arrival at the Press Club that another conference called hurriedly by the liberal Student Mobilization Committee would

begin shortly before the National Mobilization Committee conference. Spokesmen for the Student Mobilization Committee called for massive anti-war demonstrations of a pacifist and liberal nature to be limited to San Francisco and Washington, D.C.

The National Mobilization Committee conference got underway on schedule, but before the spokesmen were able to issue their statements, the running dog RYM II faction of the Los Angeles City College SDS attempted to disrupt the proceedings. Marv Traiger, head of the revisionist grouping, shouted abuse at M.I. Laski, spokesman for the Communist Party, saying that 'this provocateur must be exposed!' Traiger continued his diatribe, calling the National Mobilization Committee a fraud, and declaring that its members were "FBI", until infuriated members of the National Mobilization Committee threatened to eject him forcibly if he continued to disrupt the conference. A short scuffle ensued, after which Traiger and his followers remained fairly quiet while Laski and Ernie Smith (spokesman for the United Front) outlined the N.M.C. position on the forth-

sentiments of the bulk of the American people: that the National Mobilization Committee, its position summed up in its slogan "Bring The War Home", calls for massive demonstrations, nation-wide, wherever the American people may be; that until the American people rise up in insurrection against U.S. imperialism at home, the war will not be ended, nor the exploitation of all working people stopped.

Smith, in giving his statement, pointed to racism as an inherent quality of the imperialist system and it will not be ended until that system is destroyed. Questioned about his past activities as a black nationalist, Smith explained that his actions were based on a "low level of ideological understanding", and that he now knows that no other action but revolutionary action, which will end imperialism, will end racism. Smith explained that the United Front, a militant, predominately black organization centered in the Watts community, saw that the only way to end the exploitation and oppression that the black people have faced in four hundred years of slavery is the

LEBANON

HSINHUA (Nov 4.) The Palestinian guerrillas and the broad masses of the Lebanese people have continued their heroic counter-attacks against the frantic suppression carried out by the Lebanese authorities, according to reports from Beirut.

On the morning of October 30, the reinforced Lebanese army troops in Southeastern Lebanon launched frantic attacks with artillery, tanks and automatic weapons on the Palestinian guerrillas in Rasheya and Aiha. They hit the first-aid car of the Palestinian Red Crescent Society on its way to Aiha village to carry wounded persons.

The Palestinian guerrillas fought back in self-defense. The two sides fought a pitched battle for more than ten hours. According to Radio "Voice of Palestine", the Palestinian guerrillas who are still in control of the hills around Aiha are holding their positions in spite of heavy artillery fire of the Lebanese forces. It is reported that during their counter-attack in Rasheya, the guerrillas shelled and damaged two cars of the Lebanese army.

Armed Struggle

The frantic suppression of the Palestinian guerrillas by the Lebanese authorities has further aroused the indignation of the broad masses of Palestinian and Lebanese peoples. They have continued attacking the military installations, administration offices and army posts of the Lebanese authorities. On the morning of Oct. 30, Palestinians in Northern Lebanon attacked a new military airport at Koliat, destroying a part of its runway and a building. On the same day, in the port of Tripoli in Northern Lebanon, the armed masses who had occupied the "old town" attacked a military patrol. In the port of Saida in Southern Lebanon, the armed masses attacked an army checkpoint with machineguns and hand-grenades at an entrance of the city on the night of Oct. 29.

Curfews have been continued in Beirut and other cities of the country and reactionary troops and police are seen patrolling the streets.

CLASS WAR IN AMERICA

On the battlefields of Vietnam, the many tentacled monster of U.S. imperialism is being dealt defeat after defeat by the forces of the South Vietnam National Liberation Front. From the southern delta to the central highlands the U.S. imperialists and their puppet troops have been forced back into purely defensive positions. Adopting the strategy of static line defense that signaled the downfall of their French colonialist predecessors, the U.S. and puppet troops have withdrawn to their coastal strongholds to maintain their rapidly deteriorating position. The policies of escalation, search and destroy and strategic hamlets have all failed. In offensive after offensive, the NLF has surged over the defensive

positions of the imperialists (Saigon, Hue and Pleiku) and made the position of their base areas insecure. The Vietnamese people have proven once again that however powerful the forces of U.S. imperialism are, they collapse like a wet paper bag in the face of people's war.

We must realize however, that the defeat of U.S. imperialism will not be accomplished on the battlefields of Vietnam alone. The bloody paws of U.S. imperialism extend everywhere. From Vietnam to Guatemala, from Thailand to the black nation in the south, the imperialists carry out their policy of oppression and exploitation. The struggle of the Vietnamese people is not isolated from the struggle of the rest of the peoples of the world and least of all from the struggle against U.S. imperialism right here at home. The policy of oppression against black people in America is part of the same policy of oppression perpetrated against the Vietnamese people.

In the struggle for liberation, the people of the world have one common enemy, U.S. imperialism, and any attempt to separate those struggles, to isolate one struggle from another, is in essence to sabotage the struggle. U.S. Imperialism must be smashed!

"The contradiction between the revolutionary peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America and the imperialists headed by United States imperialism is the principle contradiction in the contemporary world. The development of this contradiction is promoting the struggle of the people of the whole world against U.S. imperialism and its lackeys."

(Lin Piao. Long Live the Victory of People's War. Peking Review. 9/3/65.)

We must clearly recognize the interrelation between the struggle of the Vietnamese people to the struggle of the rest of the people of the world and especially to our own struggle here at home. The international revolution cannot be isolated to one or another country but must be brought home to roost in the bastion of U.S. imperialism itself. U.S. imperialism extends its tentacles to all parts of the world, but it is here in the American nation, in the mother country, that its heart lies, and it is here that the death blow must be delivered. The principle task of revolutionaries in America today is to open up a second front, a second front in the vital spot to U.S. imperialism, in its heartland. Our revolution cannot be ideologically confined to national boundaries, but must take on an international character. The just struggle of the Vietnamese people in Vietnam must be coupled with insurrection here at home! We must be prepared to carry the struggle against U.S.

imperialism through to the end.

Illusions Shattered

For many years the American people have labored under the illusion that the war in Vietnam could be brought to a halt through peaceful demonstration on our part. We've staged countless mass mobilizations. On April 27, 1968, a half a million people took to the streets to express their opposition to the war. Playing the part of the loyal opposition, the anti-war movement has confined itself to the most liberal of actions and demands, fervently hoping that the 'sensible' leaders of the government would come to their 'senses' and rectify the 'folly' of the war in Vietnam. The illusion of peaceful protest has finally come unglued. Daily more and more people are recognizing that as long as war remains in the interests of U.S. imperialism, then the ruling class will continue to perpetrate war on the people. As long as the exploitation and oppression of the people of the world shows a profit, then imperialism will continue. U.S. imperialism will never depart the stage of history of its own accord. The myth of the loyal opposition has been exploded and in its place must rise the American front of the international revolution. More and more militant youth are taking Chairman Mao's slogan 'It is right to rebel' to heart. Rather than limit themselves to 'legitimate' protest against the draft, thousands of people physically attempted to prevent the Oakland induction center from proceeding as normal. During the April 27th march in New York, several hundred militants broke away from the liberal cop-out rally and began a march of their own under NLF flags and rallying to anti-imperialist slogans. In Chicago on Oct. 8-11th, members of the militant Weatherman section of SDS took to the streets and battled the pigs and the national guard under the anti-imperialist slogan of 'Bring the War Home.'

These initial actions have shown the course for a new stage of struggle, the stage where we must open a new front in America along with the rest of the people of the world and take the offensive against U.S. imperialism right in its heart. The death of imperialist war can only come with the death of imperialism itself. The question of insurrection and revolutionary warfare in America can no longer remain in the confines of intellectual debate, but must be brought into reality.

We will not allow our anger to rest on the minor chauvinistic elements of society, thereby serving the reactionary forces. Women's liberation forces are daily being led into dark tunnels of reform, bogging down in sexual rhetoric and forgetting to identify the enemy. The most outrageous of these diversions is birth control. The bourgeoisie is reaching out to women with sugar-coated bullets to bombard us with genocide in the guise of freedom. Heroic Women Of the NLF

The women of the United States need only inspect the heroism of Vietnamese women to understand the serious character of our common struggle. Sexual semantic bullshit will be immediately forgotten when faced with the staggering achievements of our sisters participating fearlessly in armed struggle. They have taken part in organizing fighting villages, maintaining security in liberated zones, opposing enemy raids, destroying roads and bridges, and dismantling strategic hamlets. Sister Nguyen Thi Ut would be highly amazed at the quantity of American verbiage that is devoted to idle chattering about day-care centers, capris, bras, make-up, household chores, and the venomous birth control pills. In twenty years of unrelenting struggle, she has born six children, six revolutionaries, while being actively engaged in combative and strategic initiatives. Of course the various social and cultural aspects of female genocide must be firmly dealt with; but, American women, like their Vietnamese sisters, must not for a second be deterred from major struggle. Never turning from battle until the ugly monster of imperialism is relentlessly defeated. Brothers and sisters, we must inscribe deep in our hearts the words of Chairman Mao, "Be resolute, fear no sacrifice and surmount every difficulty to win victory."

Revolutions and revolutionary wars are inevitable in class society and without them, it is impossible to accomplish any leap in social development and to overthrow the reactionary ruling classes and therefore impossible for the people to win political power.

UNEMPLOYMENT

UP

HSINHUA - The number of the unemployed in the U.S. rose sharply in September, with 365,000 more people out of work, according to reports from Washington. U.S. official figures alone show that the total number of unemployed has reached 3 million.

Up .5 Percent

According to watered down official figures, the unemployment rate in the U.S. (the ratio of the registered unemployed to the total number of people with labour power) rose from 3.5 percent in August to 4 percent in September, the highest since October 1967 and the largest increase since October 1960.

Rise Worries Ruling Class

The sharp increase of unemployment in September has filled the U.S. ruling class with worries about the prospects of the economy. They have to admit that the sharply rising unemployment is a sign that the economy "is cooling off" and will lead to a serious slowdown in the economy.

U.S. REVISIONISTS SEEK NEW "IMAGE"

The Hall-Healey clique, totally bankrupt in ideology or politics, is currently in the midst of a plastic surgery operation. Like a corrupted person, whose decadent life of overeating and laziness has swollen the face, the U.S. revisionists attempt to prettify themselves for the benefit of the bourgeoisie with a face-lifting. The faithful lackeys of U.S. imperialism for more than a decade, they are seeking to modernize their image with new phrases and new stage-settings, lest their bourgeois masters throw them aside in favor of a more efficient "loyal opposition". Among the latest gimmicks, the U.S. revisionists have ceased any pretense of opposition to trotskyism, and they now share the same platforms, phoney demonstrations, and letterheads, with a tendency long discredited in the international communist movement, and recognized as traitors to the proletariat: the followers of the fascist agent Trotsky. The revisionist bookstores peddle the works of Trotsky, the various rags of the Trotskyite groupings, and project the image of a political organization "tolerant" of all other tendencies. This goes in line with the Soviet revisionist line of the "Party of the whole people": since the modern revisionists are on the side of the bourgeoisie, they must claim that there is no difference between classes; since they make alliances with reactionaries, they must claim that there is no antagonism between different ideologies.

Great Britain

Also in line with the image of the "Party of the whole people", the U.S. revisionists, like the revisionists in Great Britain, have dropped the name "Worker" as the name of their publications. The organ of the British revisionists has become the "Morning Star", projecting the image of pacifism and submission. The U.S. revisionists, having long corrupted the Worker, once the Daily Worker, a proletarian revolutionary newspaper, now call their pathetic rag the Daily World, projecting the false and reactionary line of universality rather than contradiction, of class collaboration rather than class struggle, of the common interests of all nations in "one world" rather than the just struggle of oppressed nations against oppressor nations.

Drops Pretense

Dropping all pretense of support to the national-liberation struggles of oppressed nations and peoples, the U.S. revisionists have fallen into complete bourgeois pacifism and sentimentality, denouncing all wars, and all violence, ignoring the heroic armed struggles of the Vietnamese and Palestinian and other oppressed peoples, and putting forward the constant stream of "war atrocity" photographs, and defeatist garbage. The revisionists plead, alongside the bour-

geoisie and the petty-bourgeoisie, "stop the killing!". Of course, the imperialists would prefer the killing to stop: they would prefer the oppressed peoples and the proletariat to submit to oppression and exploitation without struggle. They would prefer to see surrender on the part of the Vietnamese rather than the continued victories of the liberation forces, and the basic defeat of U.S. imperialism, which spurs on the revolutionary violence and just wars of people in all countries. This is the basis for the current pacifist fad in the revisionist circles, their infatuation with the Catholic church, and other such forces that weaken the will to fight, and if necessary, to kill and die, of the proletariat and oppressed peoples. With agreement concluded between the U.S. and Soviet imperialists over nuclear weapons, the revisionists now concentrate their pacifist line against the revolutionary violence of the people.

Reactionary Culture

On the cultural front, the revisionists internationally have liquidated any possible struggle on their part against the decadent art that serves the interests of the bourgeoisie. The U.S. revisionists, following suit, have adopted every reactionary, superficial, and metaphysical type of rubbish piling up in the dung-heap of imperialist culture, including drugs, mysticism, art for arts sake, form without content, etc. etc. ad nauseam. They periodically review with favor and praise the most reactionary films and books in the pages of the Daily World. The literary publication of the revisionists, once called Mainstream, from the original Masses and Mainstream, is now called Dialogue. This also reflects the basic political line of conciliation, and no struggle. Progressive and revolutionary artists who serve the interests of the proletariat and oppressed peoples are not supposed to engage in resolute struggle against reactionary and decadent culture, but rather "dialogue". Under this heading, everything is permitted, and the least revolutionary common denominator is preferred. The pages of Dialogue, like the other revisionist hack-sheets abound with sentimentality and drivel, constantly harping on the identical nature of culture in the U.S.A. and culture in the countries ruled by

Nov. 15th in order to take the struggle against U.S. imperialism into the streets. If we become so timid and frightened that we fear to confront the enemy at all times when it is advantageous to us, then in essence we desert the camp of the revolution and objectively align with the camp of the lackeys, running dogs and class traitors. We must line up shoulder to shoulder with the revolutionary peoples of the world and take a clear, decisive stand in opposition to the forces of U.S. imperialism!

The lackeys and running dogs of the revisionist-Trotskyite coalition, RYM II and the rest of their ilk have chosen to forsake the interests of the people and line up on the side of the liberal bourgeoisie. Lessons Of Watts

The lessons of Watts, Harlem and Detroit stand out clear. The uprisings of our comrades was a heroic act indeed, but to let it go with a profound eulogy would be criminal. These uprisings were acts of armed violence against the oppressive ruling class. Masses of people in this country have been pushed so far to the wall that there can be no other response than violence. Yet the uprisings were crushed and the ruling class remains in power.

A revolutionary mass insurrection will not successfully develop spontaneously in America or anywhere else. Uprisings may and do occur, but these uprisings, due to their spontaneous character, lack of organization and a lack of direct political expression, are doomed to failure. From these uprisings we must draw definite lessons and never forget them. We need not spend much time refuting the lackeys who advance the 'spontaneous' insurrection theory. The Watts uprising is the best refutation. The necessity of revolutionary violence is indisputable, but from our past failures we must draw one conclusion.

-A revolutionary insurrection must be the planned, conscious act of violence by a certain class with the object of overthrowing another class and seizing state power.

Insurrection, Yes!

To bring about a revolutionary insurrection of the masses against the ruling class we cannot wait upon some mystical day in the future when the masses of the people take to the streets with the correct ideas, as the 'spontaneous' insurrectionists claim we should. We must take the correct ideas to the people, with the people integrate theory with practice, and with revolutionary theory initiate the armed struggle. Insurrection, Yes! Spontaneity, No!

Prepare To Struggle

jugation of principled ideological and political struggle based on class struggle and anti-imperialist struggle to the alleged "common interests of all young people" against "all war." It is this line which permitted Gurley Flynn to prettify the Kennedy imperialist gimmick of the Peace Corps, saying it was better than a war corps. It is this line that pushes unfortunate students and youth duped by the revisionists into unprincipled activities with bourgeois politicians, pacifist priests, CIA-manipulated circuses, and mistrust and isolation from proletarian youth, especially proletarian youth of the oppressed national minorities. The Center for Marxist Studies, successor to the American Institute of Marxist Studies, has attempted the same image as the farcical "Free Universities" and "Alternate Universities" with their courses on drugs and astrology. Slated to commence in October, the "Center" does not contain a

single course on the Vietnamese struggle, much less anything else of basic or correct nature. Among the courses are one on "Maoism", as part of the anti-China slander campaign. The "Center", like the bourgeois educational institutions after which it is patterned, project the false image of "freest exchange of ideas", rather than learning through practice, and the waging of ideological struggle as a component part of the class struggle.

The U.S. revisionists have played second fiddle to every campaign of lies and slander against the Peoples Republic of China and the Communist Party of China. Reprinting the works of Wang Ming (expelled from the CPC in 1935) and peddling the "little yellow book" of Liu Shao-chi, China's Kruschov, they fully express their counter-revolutionary nature, and the necessity for the proletariat to sweep them away into the rubbish heap of history.
